## CHARTER

On 26 November 1972, Judge Huxford called together a group of interested friends for the purpose of forming a genealogical society. He was then 78 years old and had recently retired after serving for a number of years as Clerk of Superior Court of Clinch County. Twenty-nine people responded to his call.

Because of his advancing years and failing eyesight, he wanted to make provisions for the preservation and use of his personal collection of genealogical materials which were the result of a lifetime spent abstracting names, dates and places of obscure people whose memory, except for his persistence would otherwise have vanished into oblivion. His research covered GA, SC, NC, and North FL.

Judge Huxford was very specific that the corporation was organized for the purpose to collect, preserve and disseminate genealogical records, especially source material and statistics pertaining to genealogy and that no part of the proceeds shall be for the benefit of any individual.
